MONTH AT GLANCE

In the month of February, the Neighborhood Coyote Program received an increased amount of reports from the prior month. Residents within the City began utilizing the hotline, online reporting, and Coyote Cacher. The Program met with officers from the Alhambra Police Department during "Coffee with a Cop", and program information was shared. All promotional materials were delivered to the SGVCOG office within the last week of February. The materials have been rationed and will be ready to be delivered to the City in the month of March.

The Neighborhood Coyote Program prepares for the March Twitter Chat, Wildlife Watch training from California Department of Fish and Wildlife, and scheduled Town halls.

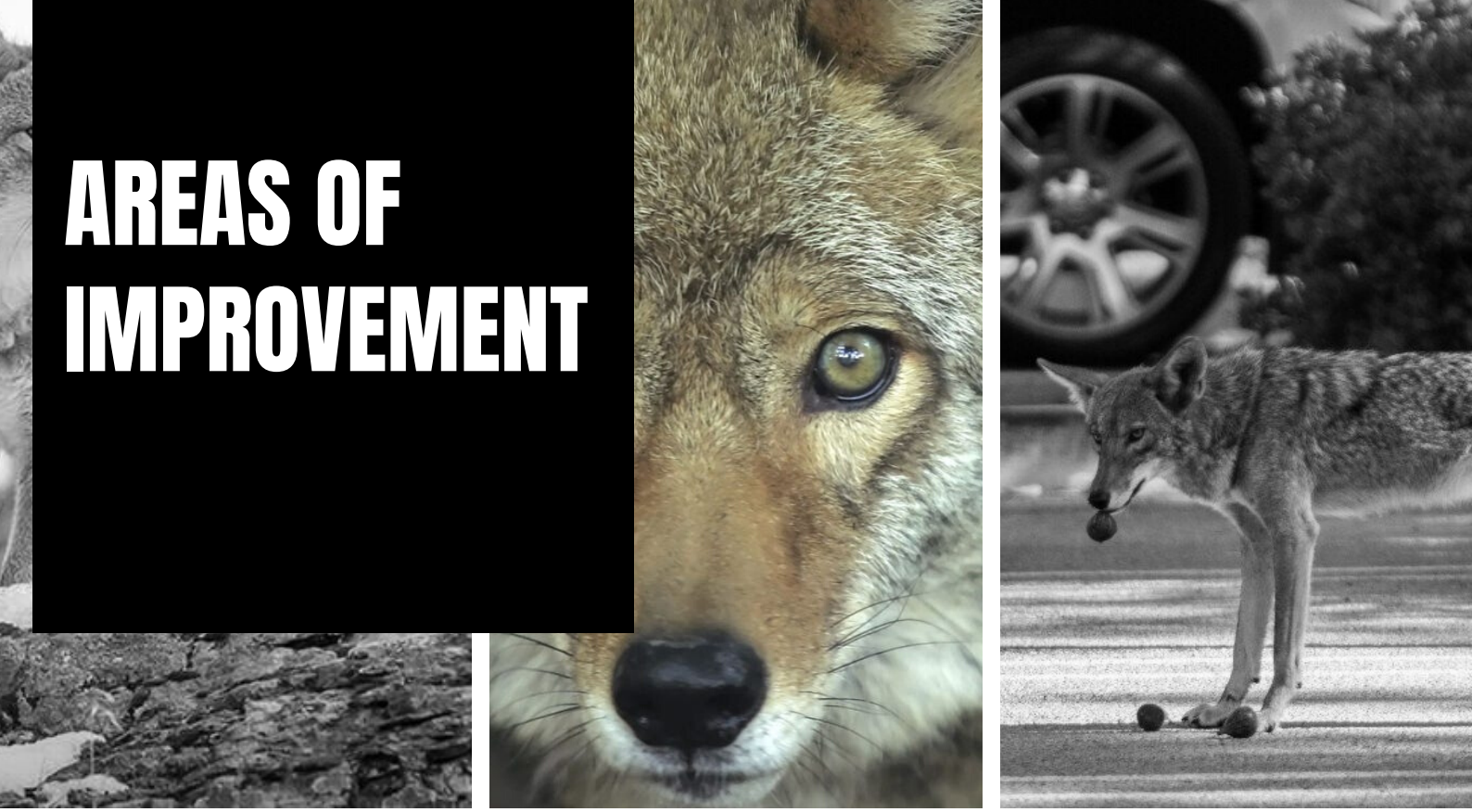
MONTHLY TOTALS AND RESPONSE LEVELS



Within the City of Alhambra, there was **1** report of coyote interactions for the month of February. Of the interactions reported, The Neighborhood Coyote Program responded to **1** report. The program made contact with the reporter by phone and/or by email. The report provided was classified as **Response Level 1**. Response Level 1 includes the hearing or sighting of coyotes. Hazing techniques were not use by the reporter. The report was made on the Neighborhood Coyote Hotline. There was a total of **5** coyotes seen in the City of Alhambra in the month of February.

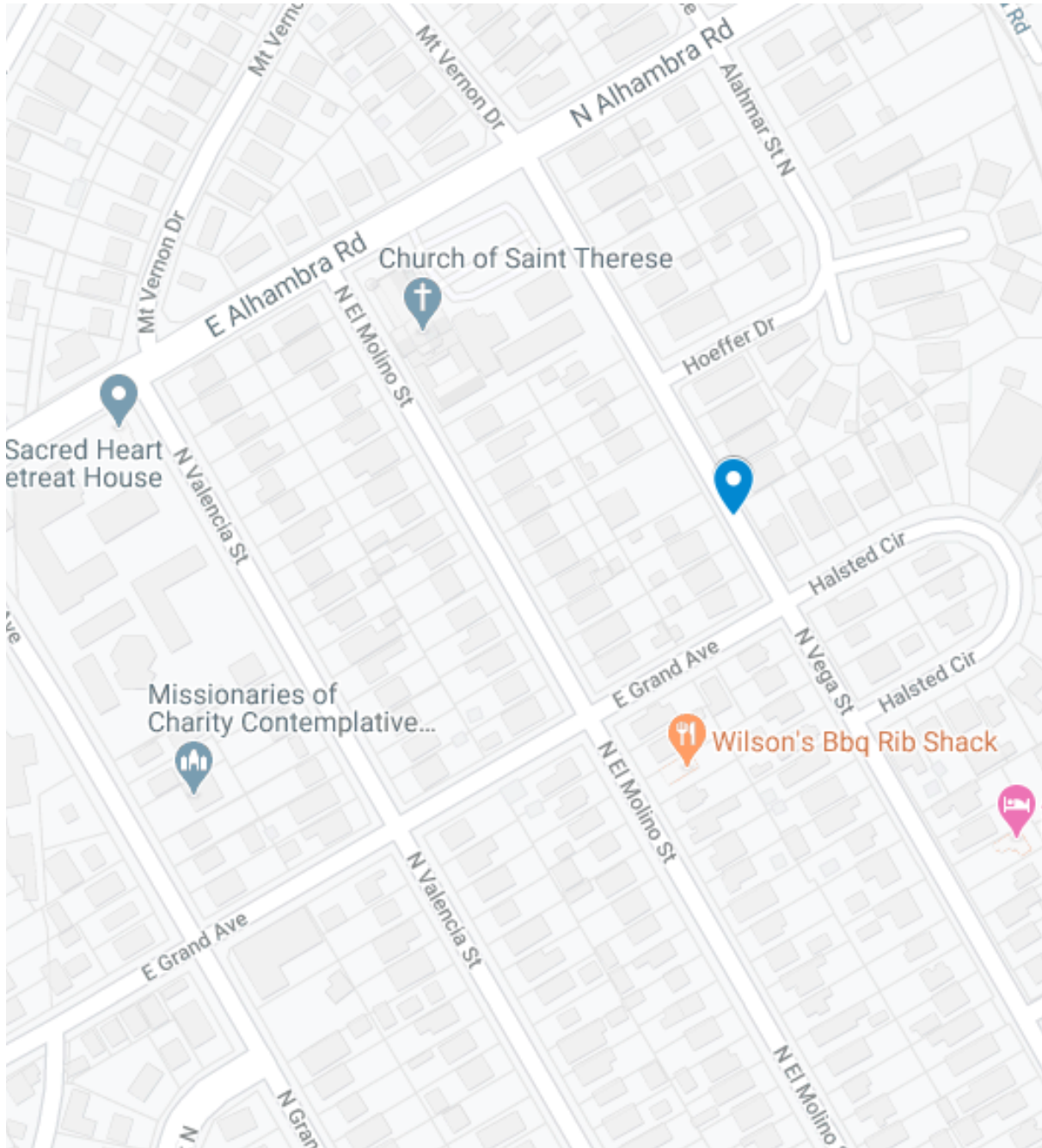
AREAS OF IMPROVEMENT



The activity reported was a sighting of a coyote in the City. There is not enough information to determine improvement areas within the City, however, there may be an opportunity to focus attention on providing education to residents about the Neighborhood Coyote Program as well as normal coyote behaviors, hazing techniques, and coyote attractants.

There are a fair amount of pools within private properties in the area that may contribute to the amount of coyotes reported.
