Pasadena City Council Votes to Rejoin the SGVCOG

On December 14, 2020, the Pasadena City Council voted to rejoin the San Gabriel Valley Council of Governments (SGVCOG) by authorizing Pasadena Mayor Victor Gordo to sign the SGVCOG's Fourth Amended and Restated Joint Exercise of Powers Agreement. According to the City's staff report, the City of Pasadena recognizes the benefits of collaborating with San Gabriel Valley cities through the SGVCOG's regional transportation, stormwater, legislative advocacy, capital projects, and homelessness efforts. With the City rejoining the agency, SGVCOG member agencies and staff look forward to welcoming the City's representatives on the SGVCOG's Governing Board and various committees and partnering with the City to better serve the residents of the San Gabriel Valley.




SGVCOG Partners with Metro to Launch San Gabriel Valley Transit Feasibility Study

The SGVCOG will soon begin developing a study to plan alternative transit solutions to solve the mobility needs within the San Gabriel Valley. The San Gabriel Valley Transit Feasibility Study stemmed from the Metro Board of Directors' decision to not pursue a proposed State Route 60 light rail alignment for the Eastside Transit Corridor Phase 2 Project. As a result, the Metro Board directed Metro staff to collaborate with the SGVCOG and prepare a feasibility study to evaluate high quality transit service options to serve the San Gabriel Valley. As part of the motion, Metro approved a transfer of \$1.5 million to the SGVCOG to fund the study.

The study will identify and analyze the mobility needs for the San Gabriel Valley that are not currently, nor will be served in the future, by the Gold Line and Metrolink rail systems. The study will also identify all existing modes of travel and travel demand, determine where gaps currently exist, and develop transit solutions both near term and long term. Transit alternatives to be evaluated may include Bus Rapid Transit (BRT), Light Rail Transit (LRT), Diesel/Electric Motorized Units, or monorail, as well as the identification of opportunities to connect the transit alternatives to existing/planned transit networks of Metro, Metrolink, and/or Foothill Transit and other local transit agencies.

It is anticipated that the study will take approximately 18 months to complete. The study will also implement an extensive outreach program that will include all impacted cities and



SGVCOG Congratulates Recipients of the 2020 San Gabriel Valley Energy Champion Awards

On December 8, 2020, the SGVCOG Energy Work Group celebrated San Gabriel Valley agencies' achievements in the 2020 San Gabriel Valley Energy Champion Awards. According to the Awards' structure, agencies that complete specific energy efficiency actions and initiatives can be recognized in the Bronze, Silver, or Gold tiers. Assemblymember Chris Holden, who chairs the Assembly Committee on Utilities and Energy, provided keynote remarks to congratulate the cities and agencies that have reached recognizable tiers. A total of 15 cities and agencies were highlighted for their accomplishments, including:

- Gold: Alhambra, Arcadia, Claremont, Duarte, El Monte, Irwindale, La Verne, Monrovia, Pomona, San Gabriel, South El Monte, South Pasadena, Walnut, and El Monte Union High School District

Arcadia Launches Homeless Resource Hub to Support Individuals Experiencing Homelessness

The City of Arcadia recently launched a Homeless Resource Hub Pilot Program to support individuals experiencing homelessness. Earlier last year, the SGVCOG received more than \$7.1 million to support homeless programs in the San Gabriel Valley. Of the total allocation, \$610,000 were awarded to various pilot programs throughout the region. The City of Arcadia submitted a pilot program application and was awarded \$150,000 to implement a planned pop-up Homeless Resource Hub to provide various services to individuals experiencing homelessness. Services include mobile showers, a laundry facility, restrooms, case managers/housing navigators from Union Station Homeless Services, and medical support from the Arcadia Fire Department.

The program commences on a weekly basis starting November 5, 2020. The City plans on holding a total of 27 events throughout the course of the pilot program.
