RE: CALRECYCLE TIRE-DERIVED AGGREGATE GRANT PROGRAM

#### **BACKGROUND**

In an effort to increase the diversion of over 40 million waste tires per year from landfills, the Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle) encourages agencies to use tire-derived aggregate (TDA) in civil engineering applications. TDA is made of shredded tires and is a lightweight, free-draining, and cheaper alternative to conventional lightweight aggregates typically used in civil engineering. One way CalRecycle accomplishes this is through their TDA Grant Program, which provides assistance to local governments exploring the use of TDA in their projects.

All California local government entities, special districts, joint powers authorities, public school districts, California state agencies, university campuses and community colleges, private for-profit entities, non-profit organizations, and qualifying tribal agencies are eligible to apply for this grant. Eligible TDA projects generally fall into one of five categories:

- Category 1: Mechanically Stabilized TDA (retaining walls).
- Category 2: Low Impact Development (storm water mitigation including storm water infiltration galleries).
- Category 3: Lightweight fill (slope stabilization, embankment fill, landslide repair, and retaining walls).
- Category 4: Vibration mitigation (under rail lines).
- Category 5: Landfill application (aggregate replacement projects such as leachate and gas collection systems, drainage layers, leachate injection). Projects that are currently underway or that have been completed at the same location within the same facility within three years of application are not eligible. Landfill application projects do not include use of shredded waste tires as alternative daily cover or alternative intermediate cover.

**RE:** AFFORDABLE CONNECTIVITY PROGRAM (ACP)

#### **BACKGROUND**

The Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP) is a Federal Communications Commission (FCC) benefit program that assists households with broadband connectivity. Through ACP, participating households receive a benefit of up to \$30 per month toward their internet service bill for eligible households and up to \$75 per month for households on qualifying Tribal lands. In addition, eligible households can receive a one-time discount of up to \$100 toward the purchase of a laptop, desktop computer, or tablet is they contribute more than \$10 and less than \$50 toward the purchase price.

While this program ensures affordable connection to broadband, there still exists a gap between eligible households and households enrolled in the program. California Broadband for All provides a map that identifies this gap by county and/or zipcode, which can be found at geochicoonline.maps.arcgis.com/apps/dashboards/a9378620990f4879a561f2bbc965541e.

#### **BACKGROUND**

The SGVCOG launched the 2022-2023 San Gabriel Valley Energy Champion Awards to encourage San Gabriel Valley cities and agencies to implement energy efficiency actions and engage in long-term energy planning activities. Requirements for cities and agencies to receive an award include implementing a combination of activities such as attending energy efficiency meetings or webinars, hosting an energy efficiency related event to the local community and submitting a project commitment form. An Energy Champion Awards Guidebook (Attachment A) is available to detail and outline the tasks that need to be taken in order to earn a particular level recognition.

Minor changes were made the 2022-2023 Energy Champion Award Structure to provide additional flexibility for San Gabriel Valley cities to progress in the Awards. Changes can be reflected in the chart below:

Agencies must first achieve Silver, Gold, and Platinum in order to obtain the highest Energy Champion level. Cities and agencies will have until November 9, 2023 to reach the highest tier. Jurisdictions who enroll in the SoCalREN Public Agency Programs after the beginning of 2022 should coordinate with SGVCOG staff about possible adjustments immediately after enrolling. The SGVCOG would like to congratulate to City of Duarte, City of Irwindale, and City of South Pasadena for obtaining Silver on the Energy Champion Awards. The twelve cities and public agencies that attended the Energy Work Group on July 19, 2022 have also received credit and are a step closer in obtaining a recognizable tier.
